

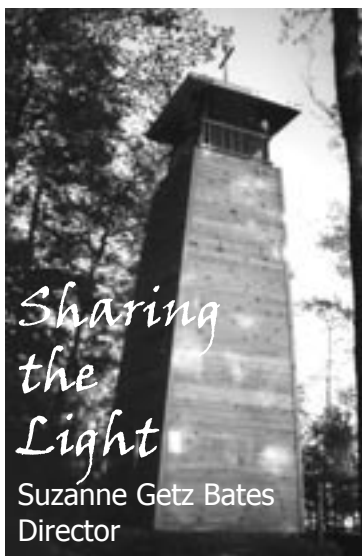

How Does Camp Westminster Partner with Parents?

We support the hard work parents and guardians do the other 352 or so days a year when their children are not at camp! Here is how we aim to be your partners:

1. We support Christian education in the home and at your local church. The camp curriculum is meant to enhance what is already being taught.
2. We teach manners. Eating family-style in the Dining Hall, using 'please' and 'thank you' in the Camp Store, treating each other with respect... these are integral parts of the summer camp program.
3. We encourage responsibility. Caring for the wakeya, taking care of personal belongings, cleaning a public area in the Camp - all of this transfers to increased responsibility at home.
4. We value the big picture. Connecting kids to a larger family has proven to increase their self-value.
5. We work hard to instill confidence in every camper who comes to Higgins Lake. Small successes translate to bigger ones later in life! It might be touching that toad, climbing the Lighthouse, leading a prayer for a small group or learning a new swim stroke. These are all successes!

Plans for the addition to the Van Dusen Mission Center are in the working drawing process currently.

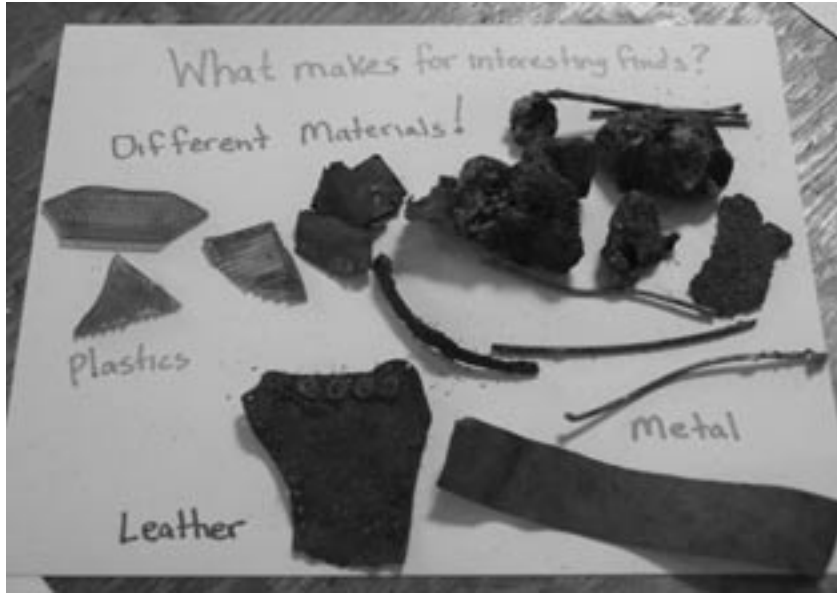


Ground will be broken Spring 2011 for this addition which will provide sleeping and meeting space for workcamps and retreat participants.

More of What We Did This Summer



So, what happened in June, July and August on Higgins Lake?

- Re-used the yurt packaging and made a giant waterslide by Wakeya 8 into Higgins Lake (see photo below).

-Nature lessons on birds, trees, water cycles, wildflowers and mushrooms. We initiated a relationship with the University of Michigan to track wildlife at Camp using Cybertrackers (handheld devices).

-A new ChooseIt!: archaeology, complete with a taste of Biblical languages and on-site digs. See photo, left, for some of the incredible finds from the Camp archaeological site. (Thanks to our seminarian-in-residence, Terra Winston!)

-Medieval dinner complete with a duel between the juggling jester and a knight.

-We saw more mushrooms than we could name or count!

-Six to 8 gallons of ice cream were churned each week, by campers. (And taste-tested by us all!)

-Expeditions to South Manitou Island, Pictured Rocks and Grand Ledge. Every expedition was packed full and had a waiting list! Wow!

-Celebrated 85 years of ministry on Higgins Lake (and the 85th birthday of Robert Frehse, Jr.- Chief's son.) See the group photo, page 4. (Note: Carol Dibiasio's meaningful sermon is available on Camp's Facebook page.)

-Hosted four ceilidhs, with the help of our staff from Scotland, Ireland and England! The Dining Hall was transformed for dancing.

-Many successful fishing trips in Higgins Lake - the record was approximately 40 fish in 40 minutes! (We finally located the old diving tower.)

-A new Worldwide Sports camp, with exposure to everything from



ultimate frisbee to rugby to cricket. The campers loved it and have asked for a two-week session.

-Two recording sessions: one with the Music & Drama/Performing Arts campers and another with the alumni at the 85th Reunion in July. CD to be released.

-Welcomed more campers with food allergies/sensitivities- for many, their first time away at camp!

The *85 Strong Campaign* received a boost in September 2010 with a grant of \$215,000 from the Worthington Family Foundation. The Worthington family were members of Westminster Church for many years. Bill and Ruth (Miesel) Worthington moved to camp with their four children – Ruth Ann, Nan, Doug, and Bill, Jr. Bill performed a number of camp roles over the years including program director, business manager, and maintenance supervisor. The children were campers and eventually staff members. Ruth Ann later served as camp doctor and Nan as camp nurse. The camp has always been a very special place for the family, especially Van Dusen Lodge where the family resided. The grant has been designated for use in upgrading and expanding Van Dusen, which is one of the most important projects in the master plan.

Frehse Society

Members of the Frehse Society are individuals who have contributed a cumulative total of \$5000 or more over the past 12 years. The Frehse Society is named in memory of Robert M. and Lydia King Frehse. Bob 'Chief' Frehse was Associate Pastor of Westminster Church of Detroit and the first director of Camp Westminster.
