Eligibility for Campership Recipients

The following guidelines qualify a camper to participate in the Camp Westminister Campership program. Financial information is submitted as part of the Camp Westminister campership application process. Characteristics are gleaned from personal interviews and conversations with references before the camper is accepted by Camp Westminister.

- Camper is self-motivated and excited to participate under the guidelines of Camp Westminister.
- Camper is respectful of others and able to follow the guidelines of positive group dynamics.
- Camper is able to fully participate in camp activities.
- Camper is committed to being a positive contributing group member and shows a genuine interest in participating, understanding that his or her commitment means full participation and completion of the program.
- Camper has a family who supports this child's attendance at Camp.
- Camper's family is unable to otherwise afford to send this child to attend Camp Westminister, as shown by their submission of income and expense information on the Camp Westminister campership application.
- The amount given toward the participation of any campership shall not exceed the amount of tuition minus the amount the family is able to pay and any amount collected from the participant's own efforts in raising funds.

Campership Program Guidelines

At Camp Westminister we believe everyone should have the opportunity to experience what camp has to offer regardless of their financial needs. Aside from income, we look at the number of children in the household and extenuating factors such as family member illness, family members in college, and so on.

Through the Campership Program, Camp Westminister strives to provide a camp experience to campers of differing social, cultural, and economic groups.

Camp Westminister prohibits discrimination against its camper applicants based on race, color, national origin, age, disability, sex, gender identify and religion.

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Camperships are based on space availability and completion of documentation as well as availability of funds for the program. No other discounts or promotions may be used with camperships.

Income Eligibility Guidelines

Camp Westminister strives to be generous and make camp attainable for all campers, regardless of ability to pay. In general, consideration will be given to any family that expresses need.

We work hard to raise funds to support this mission. Through donations, grants and sponsorships, we are able to open this door to all. Campership funds are limited, and we want to ensure they go to people who genuinely need them.

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Campership Documents

To complete your application, please include the following documents:

- A) The first two pages of your Form 1040 for the most recent tax year or other official documentation of household income.

AND

- B) A letter of recommendation from a religious leader, member of your congregation's ruling council, teacher, principal, social worker, youth worker, physician, or another person with standing in your community. The letter of recommendation should discuss the impact camp will leave on the child and how the child will be a positive contributing member of the camp community.

Your personal and financial information is confidential and will not be disclosed or discussed with anyone outside the Camp Westminister leadership team responsible for awarding Camperships.

*Camp Westminister reserves the ability to request further information from families to determine campership eligibility.
